## Acceptable Items

**PAPER:** Office paper, construction paper, newspaper, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, corrugated cardboard, telephone books, and cardboard food boxes.

**GLASS:** Clear, brown and green glass that previously contained food or beverages. **No broken glass, or window glass please!**

**STEEL:** Any food container (e.g. soup cans, canned vegetables, etc.) It is okay to leave the labels on. **No pots, pans, or bakeware.**

**ALUMINUM:** Beverage containers (e.g. soda)

**PLASTIC:** Plastic food & beverage containers with a # 1-7 can be recycled at the centers. Look on the bottom of the container for the chasing arrows symbol. The number inside the arrows represents the type of plastic. **No children's toys, garden hose, storage totes, diapers, pet food bags, plastic or wood pallets.**



## **DON'T FORGET !**

- ⇒ **Staples, paper clips and rubber bands should be removed from all paper.**
- ⇒ **Cardboard should be broken down to conserve space in the bins.**
- ⇒ **All food containers should be rinsed and lids removed.**
- ⇒ **All recyclable should be loose in the recycling bins to conserve space for others -- no bagged materials.**
